07.17 MINUTES

The confirmed minutes of the meeting held on 11 January 2007 were signed and dated by the Chair, subject to the following correction:

Min 07.15 The 'Noted (m)' section should read: "that the Faculty of Life and Health Sciences had requested that the programme be granted a further extension to the period of approval to include the 2008 intake."

MATTERS ARISING

07.18 Computing (Unit 16) (Min 07.15 (i))

The Chair reported that the Dean of the Faculty of Engineering had confirmed that the proposed revalidation schedule took into account the need for the parent programmes to be revalidated prior to the corresponding provision in each of the colleges.

07.19 COURSE APPROVAL

The Sub-Committee considered business from each Faculty (papers CASC/07/9 - 13) and noted revisions approved by the Faculties as detailed in the Appendix.

FACULTY OF ARTS

07.20 Revalidation Subject Unit 2A: Art and Design (Magee)

RECEIVED: the report of the Revalidation Panel.

NOTED: (a) that the Panel had commented on the poor quality of the programme documentation and that the Faculty had been asked to put in place the necessary processes to ensure that

documentation for future revalidation events was of an appropriate standard;

- (b) that the submission had not included information regarding evidence of demand for the programmes;
- (c) that the placement on the BDes (Hons) Design and Communication programme was managed by the Faculty of Engineering;
- (d) that the external examiner report for BDes (Hons) Design and Communication (2005/06) had highlighted a number of concerns regarding the programme and that no external examiner reports had been received for 2004/05 and 2005/06 for the PgDip/MDes Design Communication programme;
- (e) that the Panel had noted a lack of fixed projection facilities and computers in the Foyle Arts Building and had made a strong recommendation that the Faculty ensure the provision of appropriate projection facilities and review the number of Mackintosh G5 computers available;
- (f) that, at its meeting on 7 February 2007, the Teaching and Learning Committee had approved a case for the assessment of Level 1 modules within the BDes (Hons) Design and Communication programme to be by coursework only and that the Faculty had been asked to monitor the outcomes from the assessment strategy in terms of progression and performance in subsequent years;
- (g) that Professor D Hunter had now taken over from Mr H Wright as Subject Unit Co-ordinator.

AGREED:

- (i) that, subject to the conditions of the Panel being met, it be recommended to the Teaching and Learning Committee that the following provision within Subject Unit 2A be approved for a further period of five years (intakes 2007 – 2011):

Undergraduate Hons Subject: (Multimedia) Design (Main) /
BSc Hons Multimedia Computing and Design
BDes (Hons) Design and Communication (FT)
PgDip/MDes Design Communication (FT & PT);

- (ii) that, given the absence of external examiner reports for 2004/05 and 2005/06 for the PgDip/MDes Design Communication, this programme be placed on the Faculty's risk register and a report on this provision be included in next year's Annual Subject Monitoring report;
- (iii) that a section focusing on the student experience, with reference to assessment, be included in next year's ASM

report with regard to the BDes (Hons) Design and Communication programme.

07.21 Revalidation Subject Unit 2B: Art and Design (Postgraduate/Belfast)

RECEIVED: the report of the Revalidation Panel.

- NOTED:
- (a) that the PgDip/MA Irish Visual Culture programme had not run in 2006/07 owing to insufficient demand;
 - (b) that the Panel had suggested that the two 20-credit point modules and the two 40-credit point modules within the Master of Fine Arts (MFA) programme be changed to two 15-credit point modules and two 45-credit point modules;
 - (c) that a case was required to be submitted to the Teaching and Learning Committee for the inclusion of 40 or 45-credit point modules and a 120-credit point module in the 240 point MFA programme;
 - (d) that the Panel had recommended that the Team keep under review the capital and recurrent funding for the provision to ensure that the courses were sustainable;
 - (e) that both programmes were currently offered in full-time mode only and that the Panel had asked the Team to keep under review the need for part-time provision.

AGREED: that, subject to the conditions of the Panel being met, it be recommended to the Teaching and Learning Committee that the following provision within Unit 2B be approved for a further period of five years (intakes 2007 – 2011):

PgDip/MA Irish Visual Culture
Master of Fine Art.

FACULTY OF BUSINESS AND MANAGEMENT

07.22 Undergraduate Honours Subject: Advertising (Single Honours/Major/Main/Minor)

RECEIVED: the report of the Evaluation Panel.

- NOTED:
- (a) that the start date for the programme was September 2007 and that it would be delivered in full-time mode only at the Magee campus;
 - (b) that an industrial placement or study abroad was compulsory for students on the Single Honours and Major programmes following successful completion of Level 2 modules;
 - (c) that the Teaching and Learning Committee, at its meeting on 7 February 2007, had approved the omission of a

dissertation module in final year as this was in line with the range of Business-related programmes offered by the Faculty at the Magee campus and that detailed evidence had been provided of how the learning outcomes typically associated with a dissertation would be achieved;

- (d) that group work was a feature of assessment and the Panel had recommended that the volume and type of assessment be kept under review; the Faculty had also identified this as an area for investigation in its Annual Subject Monitoring report;
- (e) that the programme would be nominated to take part in a pilot 'kite-marking' scheme established by the Creative and Cultural Skills Council; that the Institute of Advertising Practitioners in Ireland would be reviewing the programme documentation with a view to providing accreditation and that formal accreditation would also be sought from the Chartered Institute of Marketing.

AGREED:

- (i) that, subject to the conditions of the Panel being met, it be recommended to the Teaching and Learning Committee that the programme be approved for a period of five years (intakes 2007 – 2011), with an initial offer standard of 240 UCAS points to include grades CC;
- (ii) that the Faculty be asked to liaise with the Quality Management and Audit Unit regarding support for accreditation.

07.23 Revalidation Subject Unit 5I: Business and Management – Level 2 at BIFHE (Min 07.06)

NOTED:

- (a) that the Dean had endorsed a four-year period of approval, which would bring the period of approval into line with the revalidation schedule for the University programmes in revalidation units 5A and 5B;
- (b) that, based on the resources available at BIFHE, the Faculty had recommended a maximum cohort size of 30 students for the part-time BSc Hons Business Studies (Level 2) programme.

AGREED:

that it be recommended to the Teaching and Learning Committee that the maximum cohort size for the part-time BSc Hons Business Studies (Level 2) programme be 30 students.

07.24 Revalidation Subject Unit 15A: Hospitality, Leisure and Consumer Studies (Min 06.114 (c) and Agreed (i))

NOTED:

- (a) that from 2008, Unit 15A would be split into Unit 15A1 (Coleraine and outcentres) and Unit 15A2 (Belfast and outcentres);

- (b) that the Faculty wished to bring forward the revalidation of Units 15A1 and 15A2 to 2007/08 in order to facilitate the relocation of the School of Hotel, Leisure and Tourism in July 2007 and that the proposed date for revalidation of the provision within these units was therefore February 2008;
- (c) that the revised revalidation schedule would have an effect on the period of approval granted for the BSc (Hons) International Hotel and Tourism Management (Level 3) programme at HTMi, Switzerland, which would be revalidated on 4 April 2007.

AGREED: that the Sub-Committee endorse the plan of the Faculty to bring forward the revalidation of Units 15A1 and 15A2 to the 2007/08 academic year.

FACULTY OF ENGINEERING

07.25 Integrated Foundation Year (IFY) for Eight Honours Degree Programmes in the School of Electrical and Mechanical Engineering

RECEIVED: the report of the Evaluation Panel.

- NOTED:
- (a) that the IFY would be offered on a full-time basis at the Jordanstown campus from September 2007;
 - (b) that the programme was one of three new proposals from the Faculty for Integrated Foundation Years which aimed to contribute to widening access and improving student retention;
 - (c) that the provision comprised Level A modules with formal assessment by coursework only, although a number of examinations would be included in semester 2 outside the formal examination schedule.

AGREED: that, subject to the condition of the Panel being met, it be recommended to the Teaching and Learning Committee that the programme be approved for a period of three years (intakes 2007 – 2009), in line with the revalidation schedule for Subject Unit 10A1, with an initial offer standard of 120 UCAS points.

07.26 BSc Construction Engineering (with DIS/DAS)

RECEIVED: a CA1 proposal to reintroduce a non-Honours BSc Construction Engineering, to be offered in full-time mode at the Jordanstown campus, without revalidation.

- NOTED:
- (a) that the proposed programme was a revised version of an existing programme, which had been omitted from the revalidation of Unit 4A in January 2006 following the

agreement with DEL to transfer the provision of Intermediate programmes to colleges of further and higher education; (the BSc Civil Engineering was in a similar position);

- (b) that the proposed reinstatement would be considered by APSC at its meeting on 29 March 2007, but that it was also being considered by the Sub-Committee as, if approved, there would be a substantial length of time before the next revalidation;
- (c) that the Faculty had requested that the validation of the programme be waived on the basis that it was an integral component in a suite of cognate programmes and that all of the modules, with the exception of four, had been revalidated as part of the revalidation of the related Honours programme during the 2006 revalidation;
- (d) that the Academic Office had asked for confirmation from an external source that the updated course continued to represent a coherent and current programme of study appropriate for a non-Honours degree;
- (e) that there was a number of factors which warranted wider discussion in considering the purpose, value and criteria for the non-Honours degree qualification:
 - the QAA's Framework for Higher Education Qualifications had identified the non-Honours degree as an Intermediate-level qualification (in credit based systems a minimum of 300 points were required);
 - the University's Qualifications Framework required 360 credit points with a minimum of 60 points at Level 3, final Honours standard (reflecting existing structures in 1990);
 - the University's specification pre-dated the introduction of other Intermediate-level qualifications, (the Foundation degree and Associate Bachelor's degree - progression routes to Honours existed from the former and the latter was an exit award from the Honours degree) and the Integrated Foundation Year;
 - the University only had a small number of non-Honours degrees remaining;
 - the entry standard for the proposed non-Honours programme was 220 UCAS points, which was acceptable for Honours degree entry to other courses offered by the University;

- that the Honours and the proposed non-Honours degrees in Construction Engineering were very close in content, with only four modules different.

- AGREED:
- (i) that, should APSC agree to the retention of the non-Honours degree within the University's Academic Plan, the Faculty be asked to submit a case to the Teaching and Learning Committee, clarifying the rationale for the non-Honours degree so that the University might revisit the need for the award as currently configured;
 - (ii) that the Teaching and Learning Committee consider whether the proposal should be approved without formal revalidation in the light of this report.

07.27 Course Withdrawals

NOTED: that the following courses had been withdrawn:

CertHE Computing for Education at Causeway Institute of Further and Higher Education
 HND Computing (Software Engineering) at Castlereagh College of Further and Higher Education
 FdSc Computing for Education at Causeway Institute of Further and Higher Education
 FdSc Computing at Lisburn Institute of Further and Higher Education
 AB Computing (CE)
 AB Computing Science (JN).

FACULTY OF LIFE AND HEALTH SCIENCES

07.28 Revalidation Subject Unit 25C: PgDip/MSc Careers Guidance

RECEIVED: the report of the Revalidation Panel.

- NOTED:
- (a) that the course had been developed in 2001, with its first intake in 2002, following an approach to the Faculty by the Northern Ireland Careers Service;
 - (b) that initially DEL had been committed to supporting students but that from 2005/06 financial assistance was no longer available, although DEL provided placements for 20 students each year;
 - (c) that recognition was being sought from the Department of Education and Science in the Republic of Ireland but that this process involved scrutiny of the syllabus and would not require a visit to the University;
 - (d) that the course had been reviewed by the Institute of Careers Guidance in 2003;

- (e) that concerns had been raised by the Institute of Careers Guidance Moderator in the report of the visit to the University in May 2006 in relation to the reduction in clerical support funded by DEL, but that the Team had assured the Panel that the current situation was satisfactory and that full-time clerical support was no longer required.

AGREED: that, subject to the condition of the Panel being met, it be recommended to the Teaching and Learning Committee that the PgDip/MSc Careers Guidance be approved for a further period of five years (intakes 2007 – 2011).

07.29 Revalidation Subject Unit 3B2: Forensic Medicine

RECEIVED: the report of the Revalidation Panel.

- NOTED:
- (a) that the provision was currently offered on a part-time basis by distance learning;
 - (b) that a new entry route of Postgraduate Certificate (previously an exit point) had been proposed for the existing PgDip/MSc Forensic Medicine programme and that the revalidation event had also included a proposal for a new part-time, stand-alone Postgraduate Certificate in Forensic Studies with no progression route currently available;
 - (c) that, in line with the Panel's recommendation, the Team now wished to change the title of the PgDip/MSc Forensic Medicine to PgCert/PgDip/MSc Forensic and Legal Medicine;
 - (d) that the law modules were offered by the Faculty of Engineering;
 - (e) that the existing PgDip Forensic Medicine was currently recognised by The Faculty of Forensic and Legal Medicine as being an appropriate entry qualification for membership and that the outcomes of the modules contributing to the current PgCert exit award in Forensic Medicine mapped to the requirements of Parts 1 and 2 of the Diploma in Medical Jurisprudence (DMJ) of the Society of Apothecaries of London, with assessment including a synoptic examination, which mirrored the arrangements of the DMJ;
 - (f) that attendance at the University was required for the examinations and that students were informed of the examination dates at the beginning of the programme;
 - (g) that, with the migration to WebCT Vista, individual modules could now be offered on a CPD basis;

(h) that a case had been submitted to VCAG for a half-time programme manager.

AGREED:

(i) that, subject to the conditions of the Panel being met, it be recommended to the Teaching and Learning Committee that the PgDip/MSc Forensic and Legal Medicine be approved for a further period of five years (intakes 2007 – 2011) and that the Postgraduate Certificate, previously an exit award only, be approved as an entry point;

(ii) that, subject to the conditions of the Panel being met, it be recommended to the Teaching and Learning Committee that the Postgraduate Certificate in Forensic Studies be approved for a period of five years (intakes 2007 – 2011).

07.30 Revalidation Subject Unit 3D: Food, Nutrition and Dietetics

RECEIVED: a request from the Faculty for a one-year extension to the period of approval for the provision within Unit 3D.

NOTED: (a) that the British Dietetic Association's revised Guidelines for Education and Training would not be available until April 2008;

(b) that the request for a one-year extension related to all the provision within Unit 3D as a substantial number of modules were shared across the programmes;

(c) that all programmes had consistently received positive external examiner reports and that issues raised by the Annual Subject Monitoring exercise had been addressed;

(d) that the professional courses had been visited by HPC in December 2006 and had been granted open-ended approval subject to routine annual monitoring.

AGREED: that the Faculty's proposal be endorsed and that it be recommended to the Teaching and Learning Committee that the period of approval for the following provision be extended to include the 2008 intake:

BSc Hons Dietetics
BSc Hons Food and Nutrition
BSc Hons Human Nutrition
PgDip/MSc Human Nutrition
PgDip/MSc Dietetics.

07.31 Revalidation Subject Unit 28H: Sport and Leisure (Colleges)

RECEIVED: a request from the Faculty for the postponement of the revalidation of the provision within Unit 28H Sport (Colleges) from January 2008 until May 2008.

- NOTED:
- (a) that the Faculty had requested the postponement owing to the changes in college structures and the ongoing deliberations of the DEL Working Group on Foundation Degrees;
 - (b) that the Academic Office had suggested that the revalidation event take place in mid/late April 2008;
 - (c) that the BSc Sports degrees would remain unaffected and that there would therefore be two separate events.

AGREED: that the revalidation of the provision within Unit 28H Sport (Colleges) be postponed until mid/late April 2008.

FACULTY OF SOCIAL SCIENCES

07.32 Revalidation Subject Unit 26H: Women's Opportunities

RECEIVED: the report of the Revalidation Panel.

- NOTED:
- (a) that both programmes were heavily oversubscribed each year and that negotiations with government training agencies were on-going to support the expansion of the programmes and to make the provision available on a full-time and part-time basis to mixed groups of students or to male only participants;
 - (b) that the programmes would be funded by ESF funding until 2008, with further possibilities of funding until 2010 and that intake was restricted under the funding arrangements;
 - (c) that the Panel had strongly recommended that the future mainstreaming and funding of the programmes be investigated and pursued as a priority;
 - (d) that it had been proposed that the placement within the CertHE programme which was undertaken in May/June would not be assessed, but that one of the Panel's conditions of approval was that the placement element be assessed;
 - (e) that there had been high failure rates in semester 1 examinations in the CertHE programme, but that this was mainly related to an IT module which had now been replaced;
 - (f) that the Chair of the Panel had asked the Dean to investigate and report on a staffing issue arising from the documentation and that, subsequent to the meeting, a further condition of approval had been added which required

the issue to be addressed and reported to the Chair of the Panel.

AGREED: that, subject to the conditions of the Panel being met, it be recommended to the Teaching and Learning Committee that the following provision be approved for a further period of up to five years (intakes 2007 – 2011) – the actual period being subject to confirmation of funding and staff resources:

CertHE in Telematics and Management Studies (Full-time)
PgDip/MSc in Professional and Management Development
(PgDip: full-time; MSc component: full-time and part-time).

07.33 Revalidation Subject Unit 18A: Law

RECEIVED: the report of the Revalidation Panel.

NOTED:

- (a) that the revalidation event had included the evaluation of LLB Law (Single Honours) to be offered on a full-time and part-time basis from September 2007 at the Jordanstown and Magee campuses;
- (b) that it had been proposed that the dissertation module in the LLB Law (Single Honours) programme be optional, but that one of the Panel's conditions of approval had been that the dissertation be compulsory on this particular programme;
- (c) that the Teaching and Learning Committee had approved a case for an optional final year dissertation in the Undergraduate Honours Subject: Law (Major) programme at Jordanstown and Magee, subject to a mapping being submitted which clarified that the learning outcomes typically associated with a dissertation were met elsewhere in the programme;
- (d) that the Panel had suggested that consideration be given to Year 2 contributing in part to the final degree classification, particularly in the case of the Single Honours programme, but that the Faculty had decided not to pursue this;
- (e) that different external examiners were currently appointed for core subjects at the two campuses, but that the Panel had stated the benefits of having the same external examiner.

AGREED: that, subject to the conditions of the Panel being met, it be recommended to the Teaching and Learning Committee that the following provision be approved for a further period of five years (intakes 2007 – 2011):

Undergraduate Honours Subject: Law (Single Honours/Major) (PT & FT) at Jordanstown and Magee

07.34 Undergraduate Honours Subject: Education (Minor)

RECEIVED: the Faculty's response to the issues raised by the Sub-Committee at its meeting on 23 November 2006 with regard to the CA3 form to replace the final year module 'Education and Conflict' with 'An Introduction to TESOL' module (min 06.132 refers).

NOTED:

- (a) that, in response to the Sub-Committee's request that consideration be given to offering the new module as an option in Year 2, the Faculty had stated that this was currently not possible owing to staffing limitations;
- (b) that, although the aims and learning outcomes of the module had been reviewed, the Sub-Committee was still not convinced that it was appropriate for this module to be designated as Level 3;
- (c) that, in response to the Sub-Committee's request that the impact of the revision on the overall aims and objectives of the programme be considered, the Faculty had stated that the new module fitted well within the overall aims and objectives for the programme but it had not included specific outcomes in relation to TESOL;
- (d) that the assessment methods for the module were stated as including unseen written examinations, but that the module was in fact assessed by 100% coursework.

AGREED:

- (i) that the module could be useful and attractive to students, but that it should be offered as an option at Level 2 and that the Faculty's response to this request was not convincing;
- (ii) that the module did not seem to sit comfortably with the rest of the programme;
- (iii) that, if the module were to remain compulsory, this should be reflected in the aims and learning outcomes of the programme;
- (iv) that information given in the module description relating to the assessment of the module be corrected to ensure consistency;
- (v) that the Faculty be asked to clarify further the rationale for the module's designation as compulsory at Level 3, taking account of the above points, for consideration at the next meeting of the Sub-Committee.

07.35 Course Withdrawal

NOTED: that the following course had been withdrawn:

PgDip/MSc Psychological Trauma Management (Jordanstown).

(b) that more proposals would be considered by APSC at its meeting on 29 March 2007 and that these may include proposals for September 2007 start.

To amend course regulations formally to recognise the Postgraduate Certificate in Further and Higher Education (four specified modules), as meeting the requirements of 60 credits within the degree; to amend the regulations to allow any four modules to contribute to a PgCert exit award.
