




Ulster Careers In Sport Employability Website www.ulster.ac.uk/careersin/sport

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Why was this website developed?

- There are a wide range of employability related resources and information available to School of Sport students across a range of platforms which makes it difficult for students to know where to go and when to access the right information at the right time.
- The Careers In Sport website was therefore developed as a one stop resource for students to access all relevant information in a timely manner.
- The website therefore provides a pathway for the development of students' employability by targeting sports specific and careers information, for each type of student at their specific stage of their career journey, to improve their career outcomes after graduation and in the longer term.


A Collaborative Approach:

Key stakeholders have involved in the development of the website from its inception. These Stakeholders include Employability and Marketing, Digital Marketing, students, alumni, careers teachers and School of Sport staff.

Plan for 2017-2018:

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The School of Sport and Employability and Marketing have secured a centrally funded placement student who will help with the development of the Careers In Sport Website.



- The placement student will also support the roll out of the website to 4 other Schools at Ulster University
- There will be the creation of an online resource for other Schools to use in the development of their own "Careers In" website.
- Liaise with students, careers teachers and staff to maximise all areas of content on the website.
- Develop opportunities for staff to utilise the website to help advise students.
- Tracking usage of the website and updating content on an ongoing basis.
