End of support for Internet Explorer

Why is Internet Explorer being retired?

Microsoft have announced that support for the Internet Explorer web browser will cease on June 15, 2022. There will be no further security updates released for Internet Explorer after this date and it will be uninstalled from all supported versions of Windows. Office 365 support on Internet Explorer has already been withdrawn.

What this means for you

In preparation for this End of Support announcement, we will have removed IE as the Default Browser on all Staff devices and promoted Microsoft's new supported browser, Edge.

What you need to do

If Internet Explorer has been your primary web browser, you will need to import any stored favourites into Microsoft Edge. This can be achieved in a few simple steps. (Importing Favourites to Edge)

Modern websites and services no longer rely on Internet Explorer and will now be fully compatible with Microsoft Edge. Therefore, no additional steps should be required to ensure continuity of service.

If you find some legacy websites and services are not compatible with Microsoft Edge, you can access still access them via <u>Internet Explorer mode</u> within Edge.
