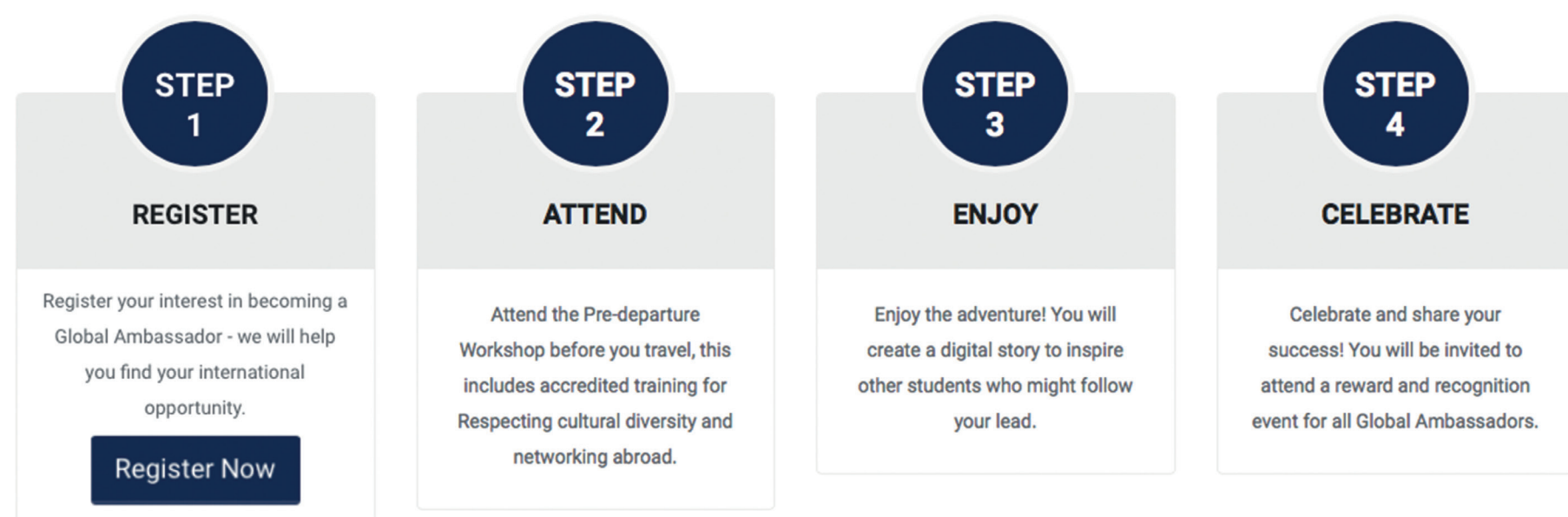


Ulster Students' Pathway to Going Global



FIT Applications

- The Fund for International Travel will support widening access students undertaking a minimum 25 weeks' international experience leading to Diploma in Professional Practice (International).
- Additional funding is allocated from Santander or Erasmus+ for those working in Europe.

Global Ambassadors

Central professional support for your students in readiness for their role through workshops, webinars and accredited learning such as

- Respecting Cultural Diversity
- Personal and Professional Resilience
- Financial Management
- Advanced Digital Literacies

Pre-departure Workshops help students to:

- Anticipate critical incidents and potential for learning through critical reflective practice.
