Exit Awards: Associate Bachelor's degree in Healthcare (AB)
Certificate in Higher Education in Healthcare (CertHE)

The BSc (Hons) Nursing Adult is a three-year full time programme (45 weeks per year) leading to the award of BSc (Hons) Nursing and professional registration with the Nursing and Midwifery Council UK. This programme is designed to comply with the PSRB, the NMC 2018 education standards 'Realising professionalism: Standards for education and training. (NMC 2018) and the requirements of the EU directive 2005/36/EC. The course has both theoretical and practice learning modules and successful completion enables students to award with the academic qualification of BSc (Hons) Nursing, Adult field of practice enabling registration with the NMC as a registered nurse (Adult).


A joint revalidation panel was held on 30th March 2020 and were this programme was recommended for approval by the panel and the NMC.

Due to the PSRB requirements all modules are compulsory and there is equal weighting in the assessment of theory and practice. There is no compensation in assessment cross theory and practice and students must complete each part of the programme in order to progress to the next. Students must achieve all learning outcomes in both theory and practice to progress to the next level.


The exit award of Associate Bachelor's degree in Healthcare derives 100% from level 5 modules. The classification will be based on 80 credits at level 5 for the four 20 credit modules – NUR 448, NUR449, NUR450 and NUR 451. This exit award does not enable registration with the NMC as a nurse.

The exit award of Certificate in Higher Education in Healthcare derives 100% from level 4 modules. The classification will be based on 80 credits at level 4 for the four 20-credit modules studied at level 4 – NUR 189, NUR 196, NUR197, NUR198. This exit award does not enable registration with the NMC as a nurse.


