PRES 2021

PRES is primarily a benchmarking tool and national results obtained from the 100 participating Higher Education institutions, incorporating almost 40,000 individual responses, provide robust benchmarking data for individual institutions.

Aside from the benchmarking data and the statistical analysis, PRES also provides a high level of qualitative information via the open ended questions at the end of each section. These anonymised comments, along with statistical analysis at the UoA level will be passed to Research Directors for information and action where required.

Participation:

All registered PhD Researchers were invited to complete the online survey, which was open from 1 March to 17 May 2021.

Following on from the success in achieving high participation rates in the last survey, an incentive scheme was again implemented whereby two £100 Amazon vouchers were offered as part of a prize draw for participation. The Doctoral College sent out a number of targeted emails inviting participation and spikes in participation were noted following distribution of such emails.

At the local level, UoAs also encouraged participation in the survey by targeting individuals who had failed to respond and this helped to increase the participation rate. The survey platform provided by BOS (Bristol Online Surveys) required participants to access the survey by a unique PhD Researchers were assured of the anonymity of the survey.

The participation rate increased from 63% in the last survey to 74%, which is well above the national average response rate of 36%. UoA and Faculty participation rates are shown in the table above.

Findings – Scaled Questions:

In line with previous surveys, scaled questions have been used to provide more robust data on each particular area of interest. Groups of questions relating to similar subject areas have been combined to form seven scaled questions and the questions making up each scale have been reproduced in Annex 1. The table below shows the mean scores for each scale over the years, along with a comparison against the national averages.
