REASON FOR REQUEST:

PgCHEP has recently undergone indirect scrutiny as part of the successful MEd Higher Education Practice evaluation (November 2018) to ensure its fitness for purpose as a feeder course for this new provision. Additional changes had previously been made through CA3 amendments which were submitted and approved (June 2017) to reflect the current institutional norm with regard to size of module, number of learning outcomes, number of assessment pieces and attendant rubrics. These enhancements were also designed to accommodate a January start for the course, which now operates across a calendar, rather than an academic, year, as requested by the PVC Education. As the PgCHEP sits within the Education portfolio and serves to model institutional practice in addition to providing initial CPD for new staff, the team is confident that the course is in step with procedural requirements.

In addition to interim changes through continuous enhancement (CA3), the programme is also currently engaging in a renewal of its Advance HE accreditation (March 2019). A consultation review conducted by Professor Mark Allinson (Head of Academic and Educational Developments, Regent's University London) on behalf of Advance HE has confirmed the innovation, standards and currency of the programme within the sector as evidenced by the following extract (February 2019) from the consultancy report:

PGCHEP looks to me to be a thoroughly designed, well tested and engaging programme. Some of the documents evidence excellent practice.

The PgCHEP comprises a small course team which has recently been diminished by the secondment of a key member of staff who plays a critical role within the delivery of both this course and the newly validated MEd in Higher Education Practice, and who was due to assume the role of Course Director 2019-20. Until this secondment is back filled, the rest of the team will be required to

configure roles and responsibilities for the coming academic year to cover delivery and additional duties. Additional pressure on the team is also anticipated (and is already starting to be evidenced) by increased numbers on the First Steps to Teaching in HE, as a result of new mandatory CPD for PhD researchers wishing to mark and assess as part of their PgTA role (agreed by ASQEC, 2018).

CURRENCY AND VALIDITY:

The curriculum remains current and valid as evidenced by the following extracts from the most recent External Examiner report (2017-18):

- *Some adjustments have been made to the structure and content of the programme this year to ensure that it continues to offer appropriate, and relevant provision as a level 7 CPD course for the University. The curriculum continues to offer a highly practical course that is relevant to the needs of the individual participants and the strategic aims of the University, while also clearly mapping to the UK Professional Standards Framework for teaching and learning in HE and integrating the standard of scholarship required for a masters' level programme.*
- *This is a mature programme that has evolved over more than 25 years, and offers a robust preparation for staff new to the University. The programme has developed significantly over this time into its current form and continues to evolve as external factors and institutional priorities change. It continues to be highly practical and relevant to both the candidates' academic practice and the strategic aims of the University. The core modules require candidates to engage with an effective range of tasks which constitute both the work-based learning element of the course, and the preparation and evidence gathering for their assessments.*

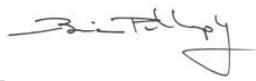
The course itself is accredited by Advance HE at D1/2 and contributes significantly to the Fellowship Target highlighted in the Ulster's 5&50 plan. The current course was reconsidered by Advance HE in 2017 under their Minor Amendment process, in the light of the structural changes made to the course alluded to above, and these changes were approved with no conditions (communication December 2017). The current accreditation period comes to an end in August 2019: the documentation to renew the accreditation has already been submitted to Advance HE, and given that there are no changes to the course that was reviewed as a minor change in 2017, the team does not anticipate any issue with this continuance. Accreditation will be notified in May 2019 and will be valid for 4 years.

DEMAND:

The PgCHEP constitutes a probationary requirement for all academic staff new to HE learning and teaching at Ulster: whilst numbers are, by necessity, dependent on recruitment, the course has consistently recruited above its target numbers (30 students per annum).

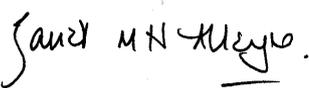
