TAKING ACCOUNTABILITY FOR OUR BOOKINGS

Across our campuses we have a wide range of meeting rooms and spaces that are centrally bookable. Those booking rooms should commit to taking accountability for their bookings – if you book it, use it or cancel your booking to free up the space for others. If you have not booked it, vacate the space for those who have.

Arriving at and departing from teaching spaces – A busy and vibrant campus is at the heart of our student and staff experience and we want to ensure smooth movement around campus, and between teaching, informal and social spaces. Timetabling is developed with ease of transfer in mind, allowing time for one class to depart and the next to arrive. For everyone's comfort, please stick to the start times and end times required by the teaching period allowing time for all students to leave the allocated room before the next class, and encourage students to move along to social spaces designed for gathering together once their teaching has concluded.



PROTECTING CONFIDENTIALITY

When using shared spaces, please respect the confidentiality of others and yourself by keeping information secure. For example, do not leave confidential documents on display in public.
