
Learning Landscapes Activity Cards





Flipped Learning





Teacher

Flipped learning is a blended mode of teaching that utillises technology to deliver video lectures or content online, outside of class so lecture time can be spent on more valuable activities.

Environment

Virtual and physical environments are normally required. A flexible space works best for this, where students can move the furniture and split into groups to collaborate on set activities.

Technology

The VLE is used heavily in this delivery mode. Although not essential, a room with projector and good Wifi would be beneficial. Ofice 365 could be used for collaboration.

Student

Students are expected to complete out of class activities before attending class. These could be watching video lectures, reading, taking quizzes and online discussions. In class students will participate in activities that relate to their discipline.

Environment

Flipped learning uses both digital and physical learning environments. Students should feel free to adjust the environment to suit how they want to learn.

Technology

Students will need a computer to access preclass activities at home or in the library. Although not essential, a laptop or mobile device might be useful for peer collaboration.
