Transitional Justice Institute bursary for Human Rights and Transitional Justice

(a 1000 pound bursary) Deadline 2 September

The Transitional Justice Institute is pleased to make available a scholarship to a particularly highly qualified candidate accepted onto the LLM Human Rights and Transitional Justice on a full- or part-time basis, to commence their studies in September 2016. This will be awarded on a partial fee basis, whereby a portion of the fees required of the successful applicant will be paid by the TJI (£1000 for successful applicant).

In selecting the successful applicant, particular attention will be paid to the likely benefit to the wider community of the applicant's participation on the degree. Such likely benefit can be evidenced through the applicant's work to date to the benefit of the wider community, to include a discussion of how participation in the programme will add value to the applicant's ongoing work and future plans. In addition, the applicant's academic credentials, as well as the likely benefit to the individual applicant, will be considered.

The scholarship will be awarded on the basis of evaluation by the Transitional Justice Institute Directorate in consultation with the LLM Course Director.

The TJI reserves the right not to award any scholarship in a particular year should suitably qualified candidates not be identified in the applicant pool.
