



TJI GENDER JUSTICE SCHOLARSHIPS for enrolment on LLM in Gender, Conflict and Human Rights 2015/16

Due to the success of its Annual Summer School, in 2015 on the theme of 'Gendering the Practices of Post-Conflict Resolution: Investigations, Reparations and Communal Repair', the Transitional Justice Institute is pleased to make available two scholarships to particularly highly qualified candidates accepted onto the LLM Gender, Conflict and Human Rights, on a full- or part-time basis, to commence their studies in September 2015. Two scholarships will be awarded on a partial fee basis, whereby a portion of the fees required of each successful applicant will be paid by the TJI (£2000 per successful applicant).

In selecting the successful applicant for the Gender Justice Scholarships, particular attention will be paid to the likely benefit to the wider community of the applicant's participation on the degree. Such likely benefit can be evidenced through the applicant's work to date to the benefit of the wider community, to include a discussion of how participation in the programme will add value to the applicant's ongoing work and future plans. In addition, the applicant's academic credentials, as well as the likely benefit to the individual applicant, will be considered.

The scholarship will be awarded on the basis of evaluation by the Transitional Justice Institute Directorate in consultation with the LLM Course Director.

The TJI reserves the right not to award any scholarship in a particular year should suitably qualified candidates not be identified in the applicant pool.

The successful applicant will be informed of the outcome of the selection process by August 21, 2015.
