# Most likely evaluation/revalidation involvement

- Panel members for
  - Foundation Degrees, FD's (FdSc, Feng, FdA)
    - Subject Networks
  - Access Diplomas
  - Other Qualifications: CertHE, Adv Dip, BSc, PgDip, etc
- New course proposal approved by Faculty, then University
- Existing course scheduled for revalidation approved by Faculty, then University

## What's a Foundation degree?

- Integration of academic and work-based learning
- 240 credits
  - Typically 120 level 4 (max 40 level 3)
  - 120 (or 100) level 5
- Full-time
  - 2 years
- Part-time
  - 3 years
- Part-time, accelerated
  - 2 calendar years (40 credits X3 semesters, X2 years)
  - HLA (3 years, 5 semesters 100 credits Y1 (over 3 semesters)
     100 credits Y2 (3 sems) and 40 credits Y3 (1 sem)

# What's Work-Based Learning?

 FDs must include at least 40 credits of workbased learning

- Progression model: 2 + BRIDGING + 1
- Bridging from 0 120 credits
- Progression table for equivalences aligned with UCAS tariff:
  - BBC 55% overall, and 55% level 5 taught modules

# What's a Subject Network?

- The same validated programme operates at 2+ partner institutions
- University's preferred model
- Arrangements for management and oversight of network through network committee
- Aim: consistent student experience

# What's an Access Diploma?

- Northern Ireland is different to rest of UK
- Modules at levels 2 and 3
- At least 60 credit points at level 3
- Access to HE: few formal qualifications and out of formal education for two years at course start date

## Admission Requirements

FD's – Acceptable Level 3 qualification – agreed tariff – Subject specific

What about GCSE English and Maths?

- For all programmers Eng Lang competency required (Grade C/04) – Ulster accept L2 ES Communication as an acceptable alternative
- For some programmes GCSE Maths required and for some subject areas level 2 Numeracy module accepted – equivalent to C only

ACCESS – no entry academic entry requirements -

• Students are Associate (Validated), Affiliate (Franchise provision), Full (Outcentre) Students of Ulster University
