SMI – social exclusion and physical health




- Stigma/Discrimination

- Unemployment
- Skills deficit (digital exclusion)
- Anxiety
- Low self-esteem
- Socially invisible

- Poor diet

- Cigarette and alcohol use
- High sugar consumption
- Side effects of psychotropic meds
