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The University Officer Training Corps (UOTC) Leadership in Practice (LiP) Development Programme is a two-day, category 4, EDGE accredited, modular personal development programme delivered by The University Officer Training Corps (UOTC). The programme has been developed for the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst by the Inspirational Development Group.

The course has been designed to give our undergraduates the relevant skills to help them both during their time at university and also in any future workplace; thus increasing their employability.

The course comprises 6 modules consisting of a mix of interactive classroom based sessions and practical exercises; all of which encourage maximum participation and discussion. UOTC staff help participants learn new useable skills and provide an environment in which they can learn a lot more about themselves.

The 6 Modules are as follows:

Leadership Planning

Followership Effective Time Management Communication Positive Personal Impact

After each module the emphasis is on the participant. The UOTC staff help participants to review their performance objectively, enabling participants to recognise their strengths and those areas where they might like to develop further.

To date there have been two programmes run – the first in semester 1 at UOTC HQ in Belfast where 27 Ulster University students passed the course and the second in semester 2 at Magilligan Army Training Centre where 42 Ulster University students passed the course.
